7 **If you need a replacement ballot**

Call 719-486-1410 or visit any VSPC. The last day for the County Clerk's Office to mail you a replacement ballot is the 8th day before election day, October 31, 2016.

All valid ballots are counted in the same manner, regardless of the closeness or outcome of any race.

1 **What is in my ballot packet?**

- Your Official Ballot
- This Secrecy Sleeve with Voter Instructions
- An Official Return Envelope

2 **How do I vote my ballot?**

Follow all of the voting instructions on your ballot. After you vote:

1. Refold your ballot
2. Place your ballot inside of this Secrecy Sleeve
3. Place the Secrecy Sleeve and ballot in the Official Return Envelope
4. Sign and date the Self-Affirmation located on your own Official Return Envelope. See the example below.

3 **Reminders**

The Official Return Envelope may only contain your ballot. If you include another voter's ballot in the same envelope, none of the ballots will count.

You must sign the Self-Affirmation for your ballot to count.

4 **How do I return my ballot?**



Mail it back,



Drop it off at a county-controlled drop box, or



Deliver it to a Voter Service and Polling Center (VSPC)

5 **Important information**

The County Clerk's Office must receive your ballot by 7:00 PM on Election Day. Postmarks do not count.

The US Postal Service (USPS) needs time to process and deliver your ballot. Therefore, we recommend personally delivering your ballot to any of the locations listed below. It is a violation of law to receive more than ten ballots for mailing or delivery in any election.

If you do return your ballot through the USPS, you must affix "adequate" or "\$.47" postage to your envelope.
