Winter Trails -

Paul – do we want a bid on contracting grooming – mountain states snowcats (Jeremy Straley, does vail pass)? White Mtn Tours? Costs? Tracking? Is this another possible angle instead of a new groomer? Or should we schedule this during CMC breaks in maintenance?

Atlas Trax discussion: There has been a two month trial of the Atlas Trax system this past winter...

Community Member Fred Mark provides a report on the ease of use.

A GPS Unit to track grooming and maintenance... Velcros to a groomer, 4 batteries that should last most of the season, once it moves 100 ft it transmits to a satellite to provide real time grooming updates... this system is typically used for billing contractactors on grooming work done. It can also be used for groomer maintenance/report. This can be merged into a google maps type view where the public can see what has been groomed in real time. The google map can include weather/services/businesses/hotels/parking/difficulty. The URL to the site could be provide via QR codes at trailheads if there is cell service.

Costs: One Unit costs 350. The ongoing fees are approximately 280 dollar annually for data use (Sends every 5 minutes at @ 16 cents). The mapping software setup is 2-5 thousand dollars on the intial setup. Then there is an annual one thousand each year. Says that this could be a great way to display our assests.

Jodi – We would need six devices –

Initial Cost: approximately 4-7 thousand (350x6=2100 for the devices, plus 2000-5000 initial mapping setup (most likely on the 2000 side)

Ongoing costs: 2800 (1000 mapping fee, plus the number of hours that all of the machines would use is about 40 hours/week (Snowmobile club, CMC, county, Wheelers, golf course). \$1.92 /hr x 40 = \$76.80 /week \$76.80 x 23 weeks (mid Nov. to mid April) = \$1766.40

Discussion

Smokey – could tourism panel help and maps be on their website as well?

Paul – could be great for out trail system

Kevin – Concerned about the costs. Is this really a need? The current google maps are great. After that the users only really want to know when something has been groomed which Jodi did a great job of this past winter. Real time updates on the location of a groomer is overkill and too costly. I think there is a simpler solution by making it easier for Jodi to make updates via her phone, or having a group text so others can update when someone is out of town. Another solution is to work directly with the groomers to find the easiest way to facilitate their communication. A simple twitter feed is free, could be updated by multiple people, and could directly update multiple websites with one update.

Jodi/Smokey to meet with the tourism panel on May 22nd about potentially coving the 1000 mapping portion of the annual fee.
